

COOK BOOK

GARDEN PROGRAM

Our Garden Program continued today with younger students building up one of our compost beds and setting fertiliser tea bins with horse manure. Our older students completed lots of planting for crops that will be ready when we return to school next year.

In the coming weeks, Simone will be setting up a wicking bed to plant veges in. We will aim to set this up with the senior students involved as a learning experience.

HELP! We are looking to install some archways to link up our garden beds to allow irrigation to move from garden bed to garden bed. If we irrigate via the archways, we don't have to dig into garden beds, under sleepers and remove paving!

Our current archway is made from two bed heads and a couple of small gates – but how good does it look? If you have old bedheads or similar at home lying around, or gate frames, or other steel products that might be able to used, please contact the school. We can pick up if you don't have a trailer!
